
Happy Birthday Theo!

We are blessed with a good number of hale and hearty octogenarians in Cantata Choirs, but we think Theo Eaves might be our first nonagenarian! Theo celebrated his big birthday in style on October 29th—which just happened to be

a Monday, so it was perfectly timed to allow members of *MAPSingers* to give him a surprise party at the end of the rehearsal!

Theo is an active member of Poynton Methodist Church and has led—indeed, is still leading - a fascinating life.

He joined the RAF in 1944, aged 19, and flew as aircrew with Bomber Command. They flew some of the most dangerous missions of the war and their chances of survival were amongst the lowest of all combatants. Over 55,000 never came home. Sixty-seven years after the end of the war, Theo was privileged to be amongst a group of around 1000 veterans who were present at the unveiling of the long-awaited memorial to Bomber



memories are of 'probing searchlights, anti-aircraft fire and prowling night-fighters, but above all of the flaming crosses hurtling earthwards, lighting up the night sky'.

After the war, Theo trained (very quickly!) as a teacher and ended his career as Head of a Salford secondary school. And he's still up for a challenge—after losing his lovely wife, Marianne, 4 years ago, Theo decided to learn to play the piano. Living proof that you're never too old to try something new!

We respect and treasure all our elderly choir members and it's always humbling to hear of the unsung heroics which have taken place over the years. Thank you for joining our ranks, Theo. Here's to many more happy years of singing together!

If you are also in the 90+ age group (and have managed to keep it quiet!!) please let us know. It's always a tremendous inspiration to others when they see people of 'more advanced' years getting on with life in all its fullness.
